The Adventures of Cubby and Coco™

Best for ages 5-7

Children follow along as Cubby (a bear) and Coco (a bunny) take them around New York's capital city. In this storybook, Cubby and Coco show us how good it feels to:

- Make new friends
- · Spread kindness through sharing
- Figure out new ways to support others
- Solve problems and make good money choices

Does Money Grow on Trees?

Recommended ages: 5-8

Young learners practice foundations of money management – earning, saving, spending and giving with hands-on carnival themed activities. Youth experience:

- Earning money by answering questions, doing simple physical tasks or expressing kindness to one another
- · Making choices of spending their earned money
- Prioritizing needs and wants

The Money Cycle

Recommended ages 7-10

Youth participate in a simulated community to understand how money moves through the neighborhood. Youth actively engage in:

- Role playing as local businesses, charitable organizations and spenders
- · Making financial decisions on what to spend
- · Classifying everyday items as a need or want
- · Exchanging money for goods and services
- Depositing money in a credit union for future savings

Quinn's Carnival Quest

Best for ages 8-10

Let's help Quinn win prizes and meet a superhero! During this create-your-own adventure story, youngsters guide Quinn through a series of financial decisions. Children watch the story they create together unfold as Quinn:

- Budgets money for things along the way
- Considers whether to start a business
- Wonders if playing lots of carnival games leads to a big prize
- Recognizes possible consequences of risking money

Change Your World: Make a Positive Impact

Best for ages 9-12

At the heart of this session for pre-teens is a simple concept. Decisions about money can make life better for them, and for people around them. We'll explore how attitudes toward money and healthy behaviors create financially capable young adults. Together let's:

- Think about our hopes and dreams
- · Consider how our financial decisions relate
- Discover ways to make a positive impact
- Explore budgeting, emergency money, and trade-offs

Best for ages 9-12

Best for ages 9-12
